Welcome to episode 148. You're probably like me, I listen to lots of podcasts. And while I have a few core podcasts I don't ever miss, I am constantly trying new shows out, looking for fresh voices I can put into my listening rotation. I'm really pretty systematic about the whole thing.

So in today's episode, I'll share my listening strategy: how I selected my "A" shows, which I never miss, how I select my "B" shows, which I selectively listen to, and how I decide what new shows to sample. And, of course, I will give you my list of 10 fresh new shows you should check out, because I think you would benefit from them.

Tip of the Week

One of my goals for the New Year was to read 52 books. I have a list I've created in Evernote of the books I want to read this year. It's already 60 books long, so I think I'll exceed my goal if it's any indication of how I'm doing so far and the books I really want to read. Getting intentional about what you want to read will change the way you evaluate what you're going to read. When I go to the bookstore I don't just pile up books because I think they look interesting, so bad for the bookstore but good for me, because I'm being more intentional about my reading.

I have a book I want to share with you that I just finished reading again. I read it a long time ago, it's '**The Go-Giver**' by Bob Burg and John David Mann. This book is a quick read, but it can tell you it will radically shift your level of success immediately. I know that sounds over the top, crazy, hypey infomercial type talk but it's true. Even better, the tactics are not faddish, they aren't things that will go away next week, next month or next year these are based on timeless principles. And while implementing what you read may not put money in your bank account tomorrow, I do believe you will feel more wealthy within 24 hours of reading it (if you put the principles into practice).

It's engaging, fun to read, and has a strong spiritual foundation (but it's not tied to any one religion). If that turns you off and you think, oh here comes Ray with another Jesus book, those are good books, this one will be easier for you to swallow if you're not into that. It is a great book. If I told you more about it, it would reduce the impact so I'm not saying anything more about it. I'm just going to tell you, you can read it this afternoon, profit it from it tonight or re-read if you read it a long time ago you'll have the experience I had where you know you read it before and you know what it's about, but re-reading it, it was a whole new book. Check it out.

If you know anything about the Amazon affiliate program you know for sure I was joking about the commission of the book. I don't care if I make a dime or a penny, I want you to read it.

Spiritual Foundations -

I promised to talk to you about what to do about being disappointed with God. I don't know if you've ever felt this before, but maybe you've experienced that sometimes you feel like things in your life are going poorly. Maybe not as great as you'd like them to be and you felt disappointed with God, especially if you listened to my show or been around me long enough to know that I believe that God still is in the business of doing miracles. He's still in the business of healing, restoring and bringing about divine supernatural success in our lives. I believe all that and I also believe we get troubles in this life, because he promised us that too.

It's not his fault it's part of the story of mankind, we chose in the beginning of our existence on earth, to live by our own rules instead of by his, so we pay the consequences of that until the whole creation is redeemed. But that's a different podcast, so let's not get into all that today. It's necessary to understand that context to understand that sometimes things happen in this world, we must understand this and this puzzles some people who cannot grasp this, that are not God's will.

You might say whoa Ray, how can you say that? Isn't God totally in control? God is totally in power, but he's not totally in control and again, maybe you're shocked, but He gave us a thing

called free will so that we can make a choice about whether to follow and love him or not. He wanted more than a robotic response is how I think about it. He can just overpower us, but He wanted us to have choices that power alone cannot give us, so if He just overpowered us and we robotically loved, adored and worshipped him than that wouldn't be true love born from our hearts. I believe and we can get into debate about this but I won't, but I believe He gave free will to the angels in Heaven.

I believe He gave free will to Lucifer, who became Satan and that's why Satan made the choices that he made. I believe that God does this because He desires relationship and relationship does not come from roboticism. Anyway, when we make choices we can choose contrary to what God wants. The Bible says that God is not willing that any should perish, but that all should be saved. We know that He gives us the choice, whether to be saved or not, to accept the work of Jesus as redemption to put us in right relationship with God. We can choose not to do that and thus we're not saved if we make that choice.

So that's not God's will but we have been given the freedom to choose. So everything that happens is not God's will. Genocide, child abuse, murder, torture, rape, natural disasters that create horrific outcomes for people and their families are not God's will. Those people that tell you these kinds of things are God's judgment, like people will say earthquakes will happen in Los Angeles because God is judging Hollywood, homosexuals, etc. That's not what's happening and if you don't like that, if that upsets you and makes you angry than feel free to write me an angry email about it. God loves us all and He instructs us to love everybody too.

It's not his will that any should suffer. It's not his will to judge people. It's not what He wants to do, that's why He sent Jesus to pay the price for the sin of the world so that the world might be saved. Now, I had to say all that so I could tell you this. Sometimes we feel let down by God because things happen in this world that are not his will and we don't know how to process that.

It's not just you or me, I mean, we may have disappointments, an illness, a situation in our family life, a break-up, destruction of a marriage or a financial mishap, bankruptcy, there are all kinds of things that could happen... a natural disaster, a car accident, you could make your own list, you have your own things I'm sure you're dealing with. Sometimes we can feel like, God, you promised me that if I prayed for things in faith you would bring them to me. You promised me that you would bless me in your word, these are promises.

You promised in Psalm 103 that you'd heal all my diseases, how come I'm still sick? You can be disappointed, but Jesus had an interesting thing to say to John the Baptist. John the Baptist was the one who announced Jesus' arrival on the earth. He saw Jesus and he said, 'behold the lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.' He knew this is the Messiah and he handed over his own ministry and said I must decrease so that He can increase. I'm not the Messiah, Jesus is. It wasn't long afterwards that John was thrown in prison, stuck there and ultimately was beheaded as a result of being imprisoned for the things he was saying against Herod, the king at that time.

So the question is this, if he thought that Jesus was the Messiah, part of the messianic prophecies of the Hebrew Scriptures say that the Messiah is the one who will set the captives free. He will release those in prison, and here's John in prison and the guy who is the Messiah isn't getting him out of prison, so John sends his disciples to Jesus to say hey, are you the one or did we make a mistake? Jesus had an interesting answer. He said, well, you just tell John what you've seen. The lame walk, the deaf hear, the prisoners are set free and blessed is he who is not offended in me.

What was Jesus saying?

I believe what he was saying was, I'm fulfilling my will through this process and things will happen that may seem like we can't understand them. They may seem and be painful and hard to take, but I'm redeeming this entire plan, even the things that are intended for your evil, the enemy intends them for evil against you, like throwing you in prison and cutting your head off, ultimately will turn out to your good. That's hard for us to understand sometimes, there are things that happen that we just do not understand.

If you've ever seen a loved one go through the process of suffering through cancer and dying as a result of that or suffering with Alzheimer's, which is terrible itself. If you've ever known someone who's experienced that, to see their personality and the essence of who they are erased, it's a frightening and horrific experience. You may witness that and think, I don't understand how good can come from this. I believe we have to accept the mystery that we don't understand everything but God does.

I want to share with you something I do whenever I'm feeling this disappointment with God. I let God know and come to him in prayer and say Lord, it seems to me that you promised this one thing but I'm getting something different and it seems like you're not keeping your promise. I know that's not true or possible, I'm not accusing you Lord, but I'm saying this is how I feel. It's okay to say that. God can take it, He's big enough to take it. In fact, King David, who wrote many Psalms...

Psalm 55...

Give ear to my prayer, O God, and hide not yourself from my plea for mercy! Attend to me, and answer me; I am restless in my complaint and I moan, because of the noise of the enemy, because of the oppression of the wicked.

For they drop trouble upon me, and in anger they bear a grudge against me. My heart is in anguish within me; the terrors of death have fallen upon me.

This sounds like pretty serious stuff.

Fear and trembling come upon me, and horror overwhelms me. And I say, "Oh, that I had wings like a dove! I would fly away and be at rest; yes, I would wander far away; I would lodge in the wilderness; Selah I would hurry to find a shelter from the raging wind and tempest."

You and I feel that way sometimes don't we? We wish we could just fly away to some peaceful place and escape what's happening to us right now?

Then David comes back to the Lord in his prayer and says...

Destroy, O Lord, divide their tongues; for I see violence and strife in the city. Day and night they go around it on its walls, and iniquity and trouble are within it. Ruin is in its midst; oppression and fraud do not depart from its marketplace. For it is not an enemy who taunts me-- then I could bear. It is not an adversary who deals insolently with me--then I could hide from him. But it is you, a man, my equal, my companion, my familiar friend.

Now he's switched from talking to God to talking to a human being who has betrayed his trust, the relationship that they had. He's talking about Saul, who at that time is the king of Israel. He goes on to say...

We used to take sweet counsel together; within God's house we walked in the throng. Let death steal over them; let them go down to Sheol alive; for evil is in their dwelling place and in their heart. But I call to God, and the Lord will save me. Evening and morning and at noon I utter my complaint and moan, and he hears my voice. He redeems my soul in safety from the battle that I wage, for many are arrayed against me. God will give ear and humble them, he who is enthroned from of old, because they do not change and do not fear God. My companion stretched out his hand against his friend she violated his covenant.

David is talking about a deep betrayal here. He goes on to say...

His speech was smooth as butter, yet war was in his heart; his words were softer than oil, yet they were drawn swords.

Then David returns to speaking to his own spirit, his own soul he says...

Cast your burden on the Lord, and he will sustain you. He will never permit the righteous to be moved. But you, o' God, will cast them down into the pit of destruction men of blood and treachery shall not live out half their days. But I will trust in you.

There's much in here that I won't go into like, as Christians and followers of Jesus I don't think it's our place to pray disaster upon our enemies, but one thing to understand here is that our enemy is not flesh and blood. Paul, the apostle writes, 'we don't war against flesh and blood but against principalities and powers.' So the enemy that God will destroy on our behalf is not human beings, even though they may be the instruments of evil that are used against us. The enemies that God will destroy on our behalf are Satan and his angels. We refer to those fallen angels as demons.

What you have to understand is that the biblical principle from the law of justice says that if we are stolen from, we have to be recompensed 7 times. So whatever the enemy, Satan, steals from us we have to be repaid 7 times, ultimately for justice to be served and God will see that ultimate justice is served, even if we don't see it in this lifetime. That doesn't mean we just give up and say this is just my lot in life, I'm doomed to disaster until the next life and I'll just have to accept that. No, but we can know with confidence that even though we can't see the solution, even though we can't see the answer in the situation we're in right now, we can pour out our complaint and feelings to God and it's good to remember He will ultimately bring you the justice you seek.

We ultimately will see justice done, no matter how bleak or impossible it looks right now. That should be an encouragement to you and if you are in this dark place where you feel disappointment, I encourage you to read the Psalms out loud. Read them with passion and emotion and feel what the psalmist was feeling. David didn't write them all, but many. Feel the emotions that are behind the hymns that are sung through God's praise and notice in many of them they're about being disappointed, confused or even angry with God, ultimately reconciling oneself to understanding that God will work all things for our good.

Feature Presentation- 10 Fresh New Podcasts You Should Check Out

Before getting into the list of 10 I want to talk about why I listen to podcasts and how I listen, what my system is for listening, because I'm fairly systematic about the whole thing. We'll start with this. I'm a lifetime learner, and I believe you should be a lifetime learner too.

One of my favorite ways to learn is through podcasts. I'm diligent about how I do it. I have 3 tiers, or "rotations" that I use for determining what podcasts I will listen to and how I will listen to them. First...

A rotation – 10 podcasts I never miss. I will share. These change occasionally because of B rotation.

B rotation – 10 podcasts I listen to selectively. New podcasts that have passed the sniff test. I listen to one or two episodes and feel this is good enough and I want to listen on a regular basis, although maybe not to every episode. I have this list that I listen to occasionally. Sometimes one of those podcasts will bump a podcast off the top 10 A rotation.

C rotation – 10-15 new shows I am checking out, and sampling. I keep a list and try them out. I listen to one or two episodes, many get eliminated because they may have a world view so opposed to mine I can't continue listening. Perhaps they aren't as valuable as I thought they might be or the contents isn't as good or the audio quality isn't good or maybe I just don't like them. Those I won't talk about because they're all in the trial phase. I will focus on the A and B rotations.

The B rotation doesn't mean they're less good than the A list it just means they're on the, I don't listen to every episode list yet. I'll explain some my reasoning behind my choices as we go through the lists. We'll go through both the A and B rotation lists and there are links to all the shows, you can click on the link and subscribe in iTunes if you're interested by going to RayEdwards.com/148.

10 Podcasts I Never Miss

1. [*This Is Your Life*](#), by [Michael Hyatt](#) and [Michele Cushatt](#) – This is one of the very best podcasts being produced today. It's done as a video and audio podcast. You have to check it out if you haven't seen the video edition, it raises the bar about how we think about doing video podcasting. They do a great audio podcast, but you get to see the process by which it's produced. It's unique, so check it out.
2. [*Podcast Answerman*](#), by [Cliff Ravenscraft](#) – You know I'm friends with Cliff and have enormous respect for him. If you need to know anything about podcasting he's your guy. He's more than just podcasting. I listen to Cliff's podcast not only for the podcasting information but for the level of enthusiasm and life that there is in the things he talks about and things that he shares. I listen and want to take my business and life to the next level. He's a great encourager. He entertains and inspires, he's uplifting and educates at the same time.
3. [*Smart Passive Income*](#), by [Pat Flynn](#) – What can I say about Pat? Who doesn't love Pat? He's likable, approachable and good looking. You just look at him and think to yourself, I trust this guy. He's so transparent, honest and open about his business about the successes and failures he's been through and where his income derives from. He's the only guy I know of that publishes an income report every month and gives detailed dollars and cents figures about where it comes from, websites, affiliate programs, how he makes the income, which months are up or down, which projects succeed and don't. It's fabulous. I love everything Pat does. It's all high quality and top notch.
4. [*48 Days*](#), by [Dan Miller](#) – Author of '48 Days to the Work You Love' book that's coming out soon in a 10th anniversary edition. I'll have an interview with Dan in the forthcoming days and week about this.

5. [*The School of Greatness*](#), by [Lewis Howes](#) – this is a new addition and this bumped someone off. I love this show. This is a fantastic show. I had a chance to meet Lewis and get to know him a little at the Inc. Mastermind meeting I intended in NYC a couple years ago and have followed him a bit since then. I just started listening to this podcast and it is fabulous. If you want a show that's encouraging, that'll get you fired up, that gives you top notch tips and tactics on how to improve your life and move from a state of where you are to a greater level of greatness than you want to listen to this podcast. He also has a fantastic voice.
6. [*Mac Power Users*](#), by [David Sparks](#) and [Katie Floyd](#) – I like it because I'm a Mac geek and I love the stuff they talk about. Sometimes it's technical. I imagine many folks listening to this show probably will not be into this show, but if you're at all interested in learning how to use your Mac effectively and efficiently and especially in the productivity aspect of the Mac world, then you owe it to yourself to check this out.
7. [*Online Marketing Made Easy*](#), by [Amy Porterfield](#) – What can I say? Amy is so friend, outgoing and engaging that you can't help but love her. She really does a fantastic job of taking the seemingly complex world of online marketing and making it easy to understand, picking guests that help simplify things like how to use Pinterest or how to use Instagram in your marketing. She has a variety of guests on different topics, experts that only she's able to get access to. I love this. Check this out.
8. [*Bethel Church Sermon of the Week*](#), by [Bethel Church in Redding, CA](#) – If you've listened to me very long you know I'm a big fan of the work that's being done and what God's doing here with Bill Johnson, the senior leader and his wife Benny and Chris Valetton and his wife Cathy. There's a whole team of fantastic warriors in the army of God. I love this podcast.
9. [*The Portfolio Life*](#), [Jeff Goins](#) – I look at it as the artist's view of life. Jeff has a new book coming out that I've been reading that's fantastic. He has a different way of looking at things that I love looking at life through the lens that he uses to view life. This is a fantastic podcast that has 5-star guests and great thoughts from Jeff, Andy Trobb is someone who co-hosts the show and adds a vital element to the whole thing.
10. [*Social Media Marketing Podcast*](#), [Michael Stelzner](#) – 45 min. on all things social media. Sometimes I have to listen more than once because social media isn't the most natural thing to me, but I think it's extremely valuable and this is my go-to source for the latest content that is relevant in this area.

Now, those are the ones I never miss and for many those won't be fresh or new, so you may say what about the fresh podcasts. Some of these may not be new to you either, because I don't know what you've listened to or not, but the next set aren't those that I recommend or I used to recommend as my never miss, but hopefully most of them are fresh to you. Most are fresh to me. I'll start with two that are not fresh to me, but I have them on this list because I don't listen to every episode.

10 Fresh New Podcasts to Check Out

(These are shows I'm just trying out or I listen to selectively)

1. [*The Charged Life*](#), [Brendon Burchard](#) – There's no reason why this show is on my occasional listing, other than the fact that I can only listen to so many podcasts and somebody has to be on the list that doesn't get every episode listened to and it just so happens that Brendon is one of those. I dip in and dive in when I see something that looks particularly interesting or fascinating that he's doing. I always enjoy the episodes so I highly recommend Brendon's podcast.

2. [The Tim Ferriss Show](#), [Tim Ferriss](#) – Why is Tim on my list of occasional podcasts, only one reason. They are so long I can't always finish them. I feel like I can never catch up. That's also a benefit, because when he does one I'm totally fascinated by, I want to listen to every minute and sometimes I listen more than once. I highly recommend it.
3. [Fizzle](#), by [Corbett Barr](#), [Chase Reeves](#), and [Caleb Wojcik](#) – I love the show. It's about being an entrepreneur, making something important and doing important work and making a living doing work that's important to you and making good stuff and feeling good about what you're making. I think that's a battle we all fight. They had an episode on recently where they talked about the fact that we fight this internal battle between I want to be an artist and produce good stuff, high quality content and just create my art.

While at the same time, I want to create things that are popular and make money. How do you marry those two, sometimes seemingly opposing viewpoints together? I thought the recent episode was a good discussion about that. They release a show every Friday that they call a discussion not a show. I love it. The only thing I'm not a fan of is all the profanity they use, but they bleep most of it, so I'm okay I'm hard to offend, but when it comes to recommending things to other people sometimes I don't want to put a stumbling block in someone's way and make them wonder why I recommended it. So I'm warning you in advance.

The reason this is on my occasion list and not my must listen to list is because I've only listened to a few episodes. This may make it into the never miss an episode list because I find the content good, it's funny and engaging. These are guys I'd like to hang out with, because I feel our world views are a little different. I find their view of things fascinating. Chase Reeves is one of the greatest designers on the Internet. He designed Pat Flynn's site. I love these guys and their show. Check it out.

4. [Social Media Examiner Show](#) (different than #10 above, this is a daily 10-minute show) – This is different than the Stelzner show from the must listen to list. This happens daily and it's 10 minutes long. It's like the bullet pointed headlines and good useful stuff about social media marketing.
5. [The 1-Day Business Breakthrough](#), by [Chris Ducker](#) and [Pat Flynn](#) – This is a new one I'm checking out. It's specifically focused on a project that Chris and Pat are doing together. Again, I haven't listened for very long because this is brand new, just like social media examiner show, it just launched this week as I'm recording this. I can say you should check it out. It may make it to the daily list, but we'll see. I like it so far.
6. [Radiolab from WNYC](#) – Some of you are thinking, what? This has nothing to do with marketing, making money online or writing books or any of the stuff you normally think or talk about Ray. Where did this come from? I love science and the way these guys approach the subject of science and they just do these in-depth interviews and examinations of topics. They do some shorter shows and I think this is one of the best shows being produced in podcast format. I love it. It's a longer forum show and I don't always have time to listen to every episode so I pick and choose those that I want to hear. If I listened to every podcast I loved I would do nothing but listen to podcasts.
7. [The Dave Ramsey Show](#) – I admire Dave so much for so many reasons. I admire the way he represents Jesus in the marketplace without being ashamed of doing it and the way he does it that doesn't alienate people and drive people away from him. I love the fact that he represents common sense in our finances and that, instead of encouraging people to do crazy things because he can make more money by doing so, he does the unpopular thing and says don't use credit cards, don't be in debt that's a bad thing, you shouldn't do it, you should be totally debt free and he gives a system for doing that.

He's been faithfully teaching that same thing for over 20 years and he's led hundreds of thousands of people to financial freedom in the process. He's built an enormous business. I have tremendous

respect for him. He's on this list just because of the reasons I've already mentioned, and that is because I can't listen to everything I love all the time.

8. [The Chalene Show](#), [Chalene Johnson](#) – This is a brand new discovery for me. I first heard about Chalene through Amy Porterfield and then again from Michael Hyatt. They both said you have to listen to her, so I started listening to the show and at first I thought I wouldn't be interested because she's like a fitness person. She's into what seemed like jazzercise to me. Then I started listening to the show and realized there's a lot to this lady that I didn't even realize. It wasn't apparent on the surface, but this show blows me away.

I never listen to it without being super motivated, feeling super positive and feeling possibilities opening up before me. She just did a series of shows recently where she was examining the possibility of stopping the podcast. She did it in the style of Serial the big radio podcast that was a hit recently, if you're into the world of podcasting. She did a series of shows that was produced in the same way, it was amazing. It was entertaining and hooked me. I'm sure this will pop into my listen to every episode list in the next few weeks because I can't not listen. She's encouraging, motivating, inspiring and she's a believer in the Lord Jesus, which I appreciate. She has standards about what comes first in her life, family; drawing boundaries around that and the time she works and doesn't, I love all of that.

9. [This American Life](#), by [Ira Glass](#) – Again, not a marketing show or remotely related to business, but I love the way Ira and his team tell stories. Some don't resonate so I don't listen to them all, but I dip in when I see a subject that I think sounds fascinating and I'm rarely disappointed. This is a great example of good long form in-depth programming that is rare in the world of radio. I think the world of podcasting is going to make this more and more common as we've seen with new shows like Start-Up, Serial and others that are now emulating the success of those shows. It will be a format that's emulated a lot.
10. [Ask Pat](#), by [Pat Flynn](#) – I don't listen to every episode but I recommend you check it out. I think this is Pat's third appearance on my list of podcasts. Pat is a brilliant entrepreneur. He took the Q&A part of his show and just moved it out into its own show. He answers one question at a time and gives an in-depth answer to each listener's question. It's something we've talked about doing here, but I haven't done it so as not to be like a copycat. I love what Pat does. I think it's one that if you haven't checked it out that you should. I recommend it.

So those are the 10 shows I think you should check out, fresh new shows. If they aren't new maybe you found one or two new ones in my lists, so hopefully you received benefit from this, at least 10 that you will check out that will be new for you that you can check out and listen to.
